Farewell to 2025 and Hello to 2026

A warm welcome to our winter edition of the gazette.

It does feel like 2025 was just a blur and the Christmas decorations have barely been stored for 5 minutes from last year.

This year saw the 30th anniversary of the village twinning with Rang Du Fliers – a town in northern France, approximately 50 minutes from Calais. A range of activities took place across the channel during the year to celebrate the occasion.

The council has been working on the Local Plan [future housing plan] that Tonbridge and Malling Borough Council are proposing. There is a public meeting on Tuesday 16th December where Matt Boughton will be attending.

We are also still waiting for the housing proposal from Barming to the East Malling Research centre to be heard by TMBC. This is likely to be in the New Year. We are also raising our concerns at Kent County Council as it felt like the village could not move for road closures and traffic lights over the last year – and, in our opinion, not seen much improvement or benefits!

Work is now booked for essential tree works in the New Year – getting ready for a new spring and new hope. But open spaces have continued its cycle of improvements and maintaining during the year.

There is plenty taking place in the community centre and we are happily promoting our regular hirers – a wide range of activities take place – ideal perhaps after the Christmas period. The centre is continuing with renovations, with fire door updates and new lighting on the stage taking place.

In relation to the council membership, Kim Nash stood down over the summer. This means there is currently one place available on the council. Please feel free to attend our main council meeting at the first Monday of the month to see what we do.

I wish you all a Happy Christmas and a Happy New Year.

Parish Council Update from the Chairman of the Council

Vacancies

The council currently has one vacancy. Serving on a Parish Council allows you to contribute to your local community for the benefit of all. We are a collective mixture of ages and expertise and we would welcome anyone that would wish to contribute. Council meetings are open to all to attend, so if you wished to find out how the council operates, please come and visit one of our meetings.

What does the Parish Council do?

The Council meets on the first Monday of each month for the Full Parish Council meeting. This would be the meeting that would cover finance, reports for the community police, County and Borough Councillors, correspondence from partner authorities and residents and planning matters.

All Council Members also meet again mid-month for the Planning, Highways and Transportation Committee. Primarily this will be for comments linked to planning applications made to Tonbridge and Malling Borough Council - the principal planning authority.

The Council is responsible for the running of the Community Centre. The Community Centre Committee meet monthly to discuss the hiring of the centre, the maintenance and running of the centre, our Kilnbarn bar and the events that go on each month.

The Council is also responsible for the open spaces such as the New Road recreation ground, the Kilnbarn recreation ground and the Quarry Local Nature Reserve. It also assists on matters such as the Public Right of Way footpaths and the Stream. This committee also meets monthly.

We also have a Finance and Administration Committee and a Personnel Committee that meet quarterly or when required.

Community Centre Committee

The Committee has over the past 12 months continued the maintenance of the Kilnbarn Bar. This year we have renovated the disabled toilet.

The Community Centre has also seen developments including the repainting of the Don Carman Hall. We are also looking at replacement stage lighting in the Oaken Hall and upgrading the sound system. The Council is also hoping to upgrade the toilets for the Don Carmen Hall during 2026.

The car park was resurfaced this year allowing the village to benefit from free parking along with users of the Community Centre.

Planning Committee

Whilst fairly quiet this year, all planning applications that are made in Ditton, whether for tree removal or cutbacks, garage conversions to large scale construction of new houses are considered by the council.

Comments made by the public are considered and the Parish Council will report to Tonbridge and Malling Borough Council it's opinions linked to any developments. Plans will be considered either by Planning Officers for Tonbridge and Malling Borough Council or actually by the local Area 3 Committee made up of TMBC members for the local area only.

Open Spaces Committee

The Committee monitor all the Open Spaces and upkeep of the green areas around the village. The council has worked hard to monitor the trees of the village and you would have seen maintenance of trees throughout the year to make sure the trees are safe and healthy and not causing any issues.

The Council Open Spaces Staff also carry out maintenance in the Infant School and in the churchyard. The Committee also manage our popular allotments which are very well tended and we continue to have a waiting list

What does a Parish Councillor Do?

A councillor's primary role is to represent their parish and the people who live in it. As part of a local council, you will work with Council staff to:

- run local services such as our open spaces and recreation facilities
- influence the long-term development policy and comment on planning applications in the parish
- improve the quality of life and the environment in our local area
- identify issues which are important to residents
- improve the lives of residents by providing local community projects, lobbying other service providers and working in partnership with other parishes, community groups and agencies.

Eligibility

You must:

- be a British, Irish or EU citizen
- be over 18 years old
- live in the parish of Ditton or within 3 miles of it or have your principal place of work in the parish of Ditton.

Peace on earth?

Heaven on earth
We need it now
I'm sick of all of this
Hanging around
Sick of sorrow
Sick of pain
Sick of hearing again and again
That there's gonna be
Peace on earth

These are words sung by the Irish rock band U2, written after the devastation of the Omagh bombing back in 1998 which killed 28 people and injured many more. In it they sing of the enormous sense of frustration we feel as we look at the world in which we live - a world we sense where life should be more than it is.

It is at Christmas especially where these emotions often hit us hardest. We look at the agony in the middle East with the terrifying war between Israel and Hamas, the pain and anguish of Ukraine, with a war now approaching its fourth winter. The images are still lodged in our minds. The emotions can be raw for us personally as we experience a lack of peace in our own lives, in our own families - it always feels so much worse at Christmas. It can be a failure in relationship, lack of security at work, the death of someone we love. We sing of peace on earth but sometimes that peace seems incredibly evasive!

Is it just a fantasy, a mirage that always seems out of reach, like sand running through our fingers? Like the songwriter we long for an end to all the sorrow, all the pain.

The season of Christmas reminds us that Peace on Earth is something that comes with a heavy price. All true peace-making requires enormous risk which is maybe why it is so rare. The risks are those of being misunderstood, misrepresented and the possibility of being left totally alone in the end. Those are the risks that Jesus took for you and me as He came to our world to bring peace. This peace is not then an empty cliché without any meaning but one which for the baby born in Bethlehem ultimately cost Him his life.

Here lies the heartbeat of the Christian faith and the Christian life. It speaks of a God who came to us, who experienced our anguish and yet triumphed through it all. He offers his peace to us now and a real hope as we look out on our troubled world.

May you have a peace filled Christmas.

Link to Hope Shoebox Appeal



He has been a wonderful asset to the team with his enthusiasm, hard work and good humour! Logan has taken ownership of their new polytunnel, growing and nurturing the plug plants, taking on the sales of fresh veg and supporting the work they do with beneficiaries in the community garden.

Logan such a personable member of the team and gets on well with people from all walks of life - the children and young people who attend the Field School, the young adults with additional needs in the Young Roots group, the adult volunteers and service users, and the customers who pop in to buy their chemical free veg and have a chat about growing food.

He always has a smile and is willing to go above and beyond to make people feel welcome and included.

On receiving the award, Logan said of his experience at Communigrow, "There's a magic in the work and community that goes on at the field– and it's a joy to see the lives of people change just by being on the land together."







As well as the work they do with children and young people, Communigrow provides free weekly therapeutic gardening sessions for adults. This includes their Garden Gate Group for people experiencing bereavement, Time Out Group for veterans, serving personnel and emergency services workers, and Gardening To Feel Great which is a wellbeing group for people aged over 55 or who have long term health conditions.
